Hello, ELDA Community!

We pray this newsletter finds you and your family well. Stories—more specifically, YOUR story—are essential. Through stories from others, we learn how God is with us, in us, and among us. These stories help us see that God is very much here in our lives, but we must choose to see. If we don't pay attention, we miss it. Let me share a powerful story with you. It's about Krista Sturtz, a cherished member of our church. Here's her story in her own words:

I celebrate life every day and praise the good Lord for allowing me to survive my cancer and live a life of constant devotion to him, for him.

Challenged it may be, I'll be grateful forever. Twenty-nine years ago, two months past my twenty-first birthday, I found myself in the ER, nearing an aneurysm. They ran a CAT scan and found a tumor on the Cerebellum. They admitted me to the hospital that day and then scheduled me for a surgical resection. I was ecstatic to hear the test results and happy to learn that I was right and not going crazy. I had diagnosed myself with having a tumor on my brain, suffering from extreme pain and the inability to stay focused. The doctors that I went to told me that it was just stress and migraines. They prescribed me drugs and sent me on my merry way. The medicine did nothing for the pain. So I suffered, waited, and found alcohol to be the temporary escape that got me diagnosed. Alcohol swells the brain. It made the tumor grow to the point of hospitalization. A great surgeon carefully removed the tumor. It left me temporarily blind and needing to learn how to walk again, but I was alive. Weeks later, I left the hospital with a rolling cane and started radiation. One month, five days a week, two times a day that was the protocol. Chemotherapy followed with 11 months of 3 days inpatient stays. One full year of treatment, 28 years of survival! With His grace, I share my story with you. What's yours?

Thank you, Krista, for sharing your story with us. My friends, what's your story?

As we swing into Fall and the start of school classes, football, colorful leaves, and cooler weather, I have a few things to share with you.

We rejoice with Bread of

Life Deaf Lutheran Church, who moved into their new location this summer. Christ the King Deaf Church (West Chester, PA) and Word of Life Deaf Lutheran (Lancaster, PA) will have a joint Deaf Women's Spiritual Retreat at the Riverview Retreat Center in Centreville, MD, which is near the Chesapeake Bay. The theme is "Live Your Faith, Follow Your Star," and will include a movie on Harriet Tubman and a visit to the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad and the Harriet Tubman Museum and Educational Center. I spent my normal two weeks in July/August as the chaplain at two different camps for Deaf Adults with special needs at Camp Pecometh in Maryland and

Camp Innabah in PA. This year's focus was on the story of "Joshua and the Battle of Jericho" so the 50+ campers learned the story beginning from Moses' death to the Jericho event. This ecumenical group continues to inspire me and the campers look forward to learning a new part of the Bible each summer along with archery, canoeing, swimming, arts and crafts, basketball, splashdown on the lake, a 'smores campfire, bowling, a visit to a retired horse farm, and "God Time!" The highlight is a camper drama of the story on the last night with costumes and props. Many volunteers and donations make this possible.

Look for information on our ELM (Episcopal-Lutheran-Methodist) mission trip to Red Bird in the summer of 2025. Pr. Lori Fuller is leading this. I understand Palms Deaf Church (Florida) has found a site for the 2026 ELDA conference.

Don't forget to plan for your Deaf Ministry to show the ASL Jesus movie soon. It costs you nothing but Deaf Missions expects you to gather the Deaf Community who pay \$11 a ticket. This is a good evangelism project as many people like to see ASL films! Consider following it with a discussion and/or study group.

Friends & Colleagues,

Our Beginning classes start Sept 10, with Intermediate and Advanced classes starting Sept 24 (the registration is attached so last call to SIGN up).

For us, Sign Language can be basic survival, but it is also art, spirituality, science, work, family, friends, and community!!

In just a few weeks, DeafCAN! will launch our new website, a new logo, slogan

"CARE COMMUNICATE CONNECT COMMUNITY."

It has been a large investment but all intended to reach out, find, and support more Deaf people in need. For most hearing people we engage, they are surprised and often say "Never really thought about it but, of course there must be.... Deaf people in prison, refugees/immigrants/asylees, those who are Deaf & Blind, parents struggling with newly born Deaf children, Deaf who were fired, divorced, homeless, in hospice care.... and yes, also doctors, lawyers, teachers, counselors all trying to make things better.

We are also 'building' a hybrid classroom to reach isolated, vulnerable Deaf people we can't reach physically, but CAN! SEE virtually, which allows us to Care Communicate, Connect, and build Community for and with them.

"From Isolation to Community" could have been our slogan, because that has always been essential part of our mission. Our hybrid classroom will soon reach Deaf Refugees/immigrants/ asylees beyond SE PA. We also hope that Deaf prisoners, isolated and spread throughout the country in Federal, State, and county prisons, with no or extremely limited access to programs and services, might now be able to have 'visits' and attend classes they can understand.

Post (we hope) COVID technology resources not only help us to reach others, but finally other, essential, even if remote services have opened doors and providing help in Sign Language:

Deaf 988 crisis/suicide hotline,

Deaf domestic violence hotline, both accessible directly by Deaf people's videophones.

Deaf counseling services, and mostly Deaf themselves, that provide many counseling specialties, accept multiple insurances, and can team with local, 'mainstream' services to provide comprehensive and equivalent care.

Deaf people now do not need to worry about being rejected because of the cost of interpreters, or misunderstood by professionals with little to no experience in working with them. Finally ("PAH"), mis-understanding, mis-takes, mis-diagnosis, and mistreatment no longer need to be the norm. The crippling dread of even seeking 'help' can now be replaced with actually getting it!

So, sure, SIGN up for our ASL classes, or put in a request for a staff training in health, human services, criminal justice, employment, housing, or other arenas. DEI, diversity equity inclusion, is not only NOT a dirty word. In fact, it is what we all seek as unique individuals, to be accepted, included, and part of a community.

As with many other nonprofits, your support is what makes our outreach and service to Deaf individuals and families possible.
